PROGRAM GUEST SPEAKERS

Dr Enrico Cementon is a consultant psychiatrist with the Orygen Youth Health. He is also active in enabling his colleagues in different service sectors to better manage the dual diagnosis needs of patients and families. Dr Cementon is a committee member of the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists' Faculty of Addiction Psychiatry and the Victorian Director of Addiction Psychiatry training. He trains students and medical and allied health staff in addiction and dual diagnosis issues on a regular basis.

Dr Kah-Seong Loke is the consultant psychiatrist with Nexus Dual Diagnosis Service, based at St Vincent's Hospital, and with Eastern Dual Diagnosis Service, based at Turning Point/Eastern Health, and an honorary clinical lecturer with the University of Melbourne. Within dual diagnosis he has special interests in amphetamine use disorders, older persons, and people of Aboriginal and CALD backgrounds, amongst other areas.

Henrique Van Dunem has lived experience of substance use and mental health issues. Through his recovery journey he has developed a deep personal understanding of mental health & AOD experiences affecting consumers, families & the wider community. He is currently employed as a peer support worker at SUMITT & is a consumer representative at various DHHS committees

Gary Croton is a mental health-AOD nurse who has worked in a dual diagnosis, capacity-building role since 1998. He created and administers the Dual Diagnosis Australia and New Zealand website. Gary has authored a range of dual diagnosis-related publications including a widely-used suite of checklists for workers and agencies to self-evaluate and develop their dual diagnosis capability.

Dr Stephen Bright is a clinical psychologist who has worked in the AOD and MH field for the past 12 years. He works as a senior dual diagnosis clinician at Monash Health and is an adjunct fellow at the National Drug Research Institute at Curtin University. Stephen has published several papers on novel psychoactive substances, drug policy, psychotherapy and psychometrics.
