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Tracheotomy Review Service

The CCLN has a major focus in caring for patients who have a tracheostomy inserted during their ICU stay.

The CCLN is a member of the Tracheostomy Review Service (TRS). The TRS is an intensivist-led multidisciplinary team that oversees the management of all non-ENT patients discharged to the wards from ICU with a tracheostomy in place.

The TRS conducts twice-weekly ward rounds to plan and implement an individualised tracheostomy weaning plan.

What is the Critical Care Liaison Nurse (CCLN) Service?

The CCLN service is a nurse-led service that promotes continuity of care for patients discharged from the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) to the ward.

We aim to:

- Promote optimal discharge to the ward from Intensive Care
- Promote continuity of care through support of patients and families
- Share critical care skills, knowledge and expertise with nursing, medical and allied health professionals
- Assist nursing staff to facilitate the safe transfer of patients from ward environment to the Intensive Care Unit, CT scan or operating theatre
- Liaise with parent teams to ensure patients receive early intervention and appropriate treatment

Critical Care Liaison Nurse Review

The CCLN will first make contact with you and your family in the ICU.

On the ward, you will be reviewed by the CCLN regularly until they feel that you are progressing well and no longer require review.

Some patients require many visits, while others may recover more quickly and not need continuing CCLN review.

The CCLN works together with the nurses on the ward to optimise your care and to ensure that your period of hospitalisation is not prolonged.
