What is AOD Pathways?

Alcohol and Other Drugs (AOD) Pathways is a state-wide service delivered by Turning Point. The service offers brief intervention, case management and family support. The aim of AOD Pathways is to connect individuals and their family and friends to appropriate local support services. The AOD Pathways service works with those who have experienced difficulty in accessing drug and alcohol treatment due to complex and multiple needs.

Who is eligible?

Individuals and their family and friends will be considered for AOD Pathways where there is:

- problematic substance use
- complex and multiple needs in addition to problematic substance use, and
- previous unsuccessful attempts to seek and access treatment at local AOD services.

Who can refer?

Referrals can be made by:

- catchment based intake services
- AOD assessment and treatment services
- DirectLine, Family Drug Help, YoDAA
- General Practitioners
- other primary and specialist health services, and
- self-referrals, including carers, families and significant others.
